## Class Policies

### ***Materials needed:***

Come prepared to class **every day** with the following:

- **Writing utensils** (pen is ok)
- A composition notebook
- A personal reading book
- A folder to hold packets and handouts

### ***Cell Phones and Electronic Devices:***

A growing body of research suggests that cell phones are actively harming students' learning abilities. Please follow [this link](#) and [this link](#) from author Nicholas Carr if you are interested in examples of this research. We **MUST** be in charge of our FOMO (fear of missing out). Therefore, **cell phones and electronic devices are not allowed** in the classroom during instruction **and** work time.

- 1<sup>st</sup> offense: retrieve at the end of the class period
- 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: retrieve at the end of the day from office and parent is notified.

### ***Absences and Tardies:***

I will take attendance within the first twenty minutes of class. Students who are not in their assigned seat at that time will be marked absent. After this time, students will be marked absent. Students who arrive late are tardy. *To make up absences and tardies, students must attend attendance school.*

### ***Video Policy:***

We will occasionally watch video clips that relate to our readings. Some videos will include *Of Mice and Men*, PG-13 (1992); *The Great Gatsby*, PG-13 (2013). If any other videos are shown, a note will be sent home.

## Grading Policies

### **Grades:**

I use the standard grading scale of Copper Hills High school.

I expect **quality** work. Not quality work means a **very disappointing** score.

### **Late work:**

- Assignments and assessments turned in by the due date may be re-done.
- **Late deadlines** happen twice a quarter. Once at **mid-terms** and once **one week before the quarter ends**. I WILL NOT ACCEPT ANY ABSENT/LATE/REDONE WORK after these deadlines.
  - However, if there is an assignment close to the late deadline, it may have its own late deadline.
  - If there are extenuating circumstances, I need to know about them **before** the late deadline.

### **Retakes:**

- I allow retakes on tests as long as they are **NOT** multiple choice tests. Students **may not** retake any tests after the late deadline has passed.

### **Re-dos:**

- Students may re-do any assignment until the late deadline. **I do not accept any redone assignments after the late deadline has passed.**

### **Absent Work:**

- If you are going to be absent, you must let me know ahead of time, and I will get you as much work as I can.
- You still must turn in **all your work** before the late deadline. If you cannot, you must arrange an alternate deadline with me **before** the late deadline

## Policies of Integrity

### **Plagiarism:**

Plagiarism is using someone else's thoughts, ideas, or words without giving the original author credit. Plagiarism is academic theft and considered cheating. All 10th Grade LA classes have the same consequences when dealing with plagiarism.

- 1<sup>st</sup> offense: Zero on the assignment, teaching moment with student, and parent notified.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: Zero on the assignment, parent contact, and note made in academic disciplinary record.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: Zero on the assignment, a meeting with parent, student, and administrator as well as a note made in academic disciplinary record.

### **Cheating:**

Applies to **both** the student who allows his assignment to be copied and the student who copied the assignment:

- 1<sup>st</sup> offense: Zero on the assignment, teaching moment with both students, parent notified, allowed to redo/retake
- 2<sup>nd</sup> offense: Zero on the assignment, parent contact, not allowed to redo/retake
- 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: Zero on the assignment, a meeting with parent, student, and administrator as well as a note made in academic disciplinary record.

### **Transferring classes:**

If you enter or leave my class in the middle of the quarter, you can expect your grade to follow you. If you transfer into my class, the grade you bring with you is non-negotiable.
